

E. L. YARWOOD, 57 DIED LAST NIGHT IN HEART ATTACK

Was Out in Cow Barn Milking and Died Instantly

E. L. Yarwood, well known Calmar township farmer, died suddenly last evening, Monday, Sept. 25 at 7:30 o'clock at his farm home from a heart attack. He suffered a first attack last Wednesday night, but was able to be up and around.

Mr. Yarwood was in the cow barn milking when he suffered the last attack. His son, Donald and son-in-law, Lloyd Baker, were also in the barn milking at the time. When Mr. Baker walked by his father-in-law, he observed he was slumped over against the cow he was milking.

A doctor was called and also Col. O. B. Goodno, a near neighbor, who with his son and hired man responded to a call, but Mr. Yarwood was dead before the doctor or the Goodnos arrived.

Mr. Yarwood was a son of George W. and Maria (Lee) Yarwood, and was born in Calmar township, Winneshiek county, Iowa, Sept. 28, 1881 and would have reached his 58th birthday next Thursday.

On Feb. 22, 1905, he was married to Miss Jennie Risdahl, who with two sons and four daughters survive him. They are Earl Yarwood, Waukon, Iowa; Dorothy (Mrs. Richard Rolfs), of near Burr Oak; Ethel (Mrs. Elmer Fadness), Canoe township; Gladys (Mrs. Lloyd Baker), Prosper, Minn.; Donald and Doris at home. A son, Melvin, died at the age of five.

Surviving also are a brother, William of Austin, Minn., and a sister, Mrs. Cyrus Barfoot of Decorah, and nine grandchildren.

Mr. Yarwood was a highly respected and esteemed citizen, who enjoyed a wide friendship. His sudden death came as a shock to his neighbors and many friends, who extend sincere sympathy to the bereaved ones.

The remains are now at the Fjelstul funeral home in Decorah. The funeral services will be held Thursday from the family home and Decorah Lutheran church. The Rev. T. A. Hoff will officiate.
