

Yarwood Notes

First: This is quite possibly the last of these Notes - at least on a regular basis. Those of you in California have probably been reading about the reduction-in-force in the Department of Transportation. There is as yet no definite word, but it appears that I will be affected. Just how, is still unknown. Supposedly the first letters are to be mailed Friday (24th), and I may know more before this is finished.

I appreciate all of the information that you have sent to me, and will try to get everything in this issue that has been received.

I have a few corrections to make in the information about the descendants of George W. YARWOOD - my great-grandfather. Most come from the old family Bible. Ethel (Yarwood) FADNESS had it, and she gave it to her sister, Dorothy (Y) EMMONS, who sent it on to me. In addition to births, deaths, etc., there are several newspaper clippings pasted in it.

Under I-1, George W. YARWOOD - Maria's brother, Walter LEE and sisters Mrs. Geo. HISLOP of Decorah & Mrs. Susan SMITH of Postville were mentioned in her obituary. It also states that she came to Winneshiek County in 1854. George's obituary had a hand-written note that he got sick 29 October, died 18 November (1905).

II-3 George E. YARWOOD - d. Thurs 18 Mar of pneumonia (after 1917 and before 1930.)

II-? Two children died in infancy - one, Thomas W. other not named.

II-2 Caroline R. YARWOOD - her husband's father was from Ohio and came to Decorah in 1855.

II-4 Charles F. YARWOOD - Olive SMITH's father was born in N.Y, and her mother in Wisconsin. They (Charles & Olive) had a child who died in infancy. Charles died in Madison Twp. of heart trouble.

Charles & Mary(SCHRUBBE) - Edward's name might have been Edwin (per Jessie). They had a premature boy who died at birth.

II-5 William L. YARWOOD and Mary McCULLOCH were married in Conover twp., not Decorah.

II-6 Laura YARWOOD and Abner DORN, were (probably) married 9 June 1892, Tuesday. Laura died in Minneapolis.

II-7 Jessie Maria (not Marin) YARWOOD, and Ferdinand OEHLER were married Wednesday, 28 Feb 1890, in Calmar twp. Ferdinand's middle initial was H.

That covers most of the changes I have had to make to my copy.

IN MEMORIAM OF WILLIAM H. YARWOOD

A Faithful Servant Gone To His Reward.

A Friend's Tribute to Humility.

William Yarwood was born (on the island of Mauritius) on the 24th of May, 1819, consequently was 87 years, one month and 17 days old when he left us alone at Mohler early in the after noon of July 10, 1906.

His wife passed away March 28, 1891. The following are left to mourn the parent's loss: W.H., D.S., E.E., and Miss Eliza Yarwood of Mohler, Mrs. Alice Roberts of South Bend, Ind., W.J. Yarwood of Krupp, and C.E. Yarwood of Yuma, Arizona.

His parents removed to England when he was a small lad, where he grew to manhood, but in the year 1848 he braved the dangers of the Atlantic and came to America, settling first in the state of New York. From there he went to Wisconsin, thence to Indiana, where he remained until the autumn of 1878. In company with his family, he crossed the continent to California, having been preceded by three sons the previous year. But the spirit of unrest was upon him and the following spring found him in Walla Walla. The famous Big Bend was then in its infancy, and to its lonely grass covered hills he wended his way early in the year 1881, settling on a homestead four miles west of Harrington, with five of his children near with like homes of their own.

Thus we see he has lived on two continents and in three countries and more than half circled the globe, but was destined to become a fixture of the "far west." He held offices of trust both in the east and this county, in the last mentioned being appointed to the office of treasurer at its organization and afterward served one term as the choice of its people.

"Full of years", as we say, but until the feebleness of age overtook him, he was ever faithful in Christian work.

How well we remember him in the years gone by as the leader and life of Sabbath school and church service. He was the ready and willing guide in our weak efforts and to him alone are we indebted for success in those undertakings.

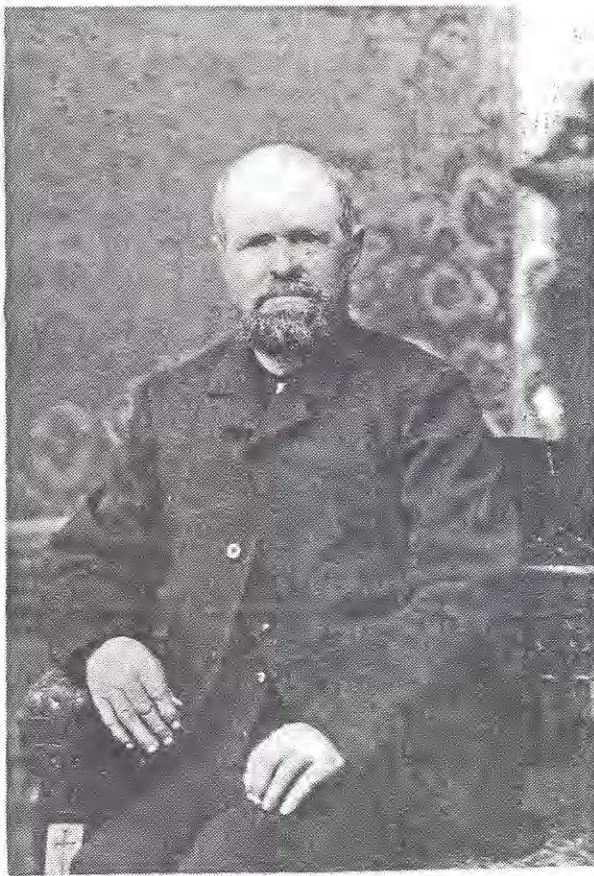
The good he did time and eternity will tell, but we feel that those earnest petitions he was wont to utter have reached the Throne of Grace and been recorded, and we hope the seed sown may return the hundred fold.

We miss him, but think we have heard the glad shouts of loved ones gone before him as the "Mystic River" was crossed and the "pale boatman" landed on the shining strand with a ransomed soul, where there is neither sorrow nor death.

"He hath delivered my soul in peace from the battle that was against me."

(Mohler is in Washington, as you may have guessed.)

Joyce wonders if William might have been my great-grandfather's brother, since both came from England to New York, and later moved on west. I wish I knew. It's possible, since my grandfather was named William. W.H.Y. moved to England as a "small lad", which could easily have been before George W. was born. Who knows? If we search long enough and in the right places, maybe we'll find out. I wonder what happened to George's brother Thomas, whose name is on the 1870 Census with him?

Mrs. Edna B. KAPPLER furnished most of the following information, she writes very interesting letters. Mrs. KAPPLER is an aunt of George & Thomas (T.M.) YARWOOD, cousins, who live in California. T.M. & Marcie (his wife) furnished some additional information about his family.

I-1 Joseph YARWOOD, m. Frances SMITH. They had fifteen children, of whom ten died in infancy. He was very musical, sang, composed and led the choir in the Greek Church in Manchester, England. He also had a second family, but Mrs. KAPPLER has no information about them. The five children who survived were:

"I'd like to extol about my father. He was such a sweet man - modest - well principled and capable. I loved him. - - - - He had a fine Baritone voice and sang in choirs in N. E. as a paid soloist.
"Somehow he landed in Philadelphia and became a meaner (?)
"but studied music at every opportunity. He took a room in a boarding house where he met and married my beautiful mother.
"They moved to Brooklyn, N.Y. where George was born. Soon they moved back to Phila. where Dad opened a music store. He played trombone and baritone very well - played in orchestras in theaters and in many parades with the 1st regiment band. He also taught.
"He arranged music, even for John Philip Sousa. He would take groups of men in organizations and patiently teach them until they were excellent marching bands. He had music stores right along
"even at his death of cancer in 1923."

In an 1895 letter, he mentioned visiting his father in Scotland.
